MUSIC



Forces used to produce sounds in music instruments by moving air (wind instruments), vibrating strings or vibrating whole bodies (drums). Note lengths expressed in beats, as well as note patterns. Learn about plucked string instruments family (guitar, ukulele, bass guitar).

Visual arts using music as a powerful aid in their expression. Look/listen to various Disney videos that use Classical and Jazz music, with and without the music and compare the influence of music; create own music for a Disney video. Rest lengths expressed in beats. Sing with jumpy, energetic rhythms.

Learn about plucked strings folk instruments family (mandolin, bouzouki, balalaika etc).

<u>Athletics</u>

In preparation of our annual Sports Day the students will be participating in a variety of modified athletics events, including sprinting, jumping and throwing activities. The children will be taught the basic components of each of the athletics skills, using the correct technique.
